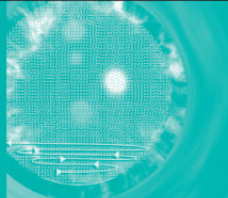


Laser Refractive Surgery

What is LASIK?



LASIK (Laser Assisted In-Situ Keratomileusis) is the quickest and most stable method to correct refractive problems. During the surgery, your eye is anaesthetised and an eyelid holder is placed into your eye to prevent blinking. An instrument is used to cut a flap in your cornea, following which a computer-controlled laser beam vaporises a portion of the corneal tissue to change the shape of the cornea. Finally, the flap is put back in position without any stitches. The benefits of LASIK include less surface area to heal, less risk of scarring and corneal haze, reduced post-operative discomfort and most importantly, a quicker visual rehabilitation (often within a day or so).

What is IntraLase LASIK?

IntraLase is the contemporary method used in the first part of the LASIK procedure. It makes LASIK safer by replacing the traditional blade with a femtosecond laser, minimizing flap complications and improving the safety and efficacy of LASIK as a result.

Who is suitable for LASIK?

- You are likely to be suitable for LASIK if:
 - You have reached the age of 18
 - You have healthy eyes
 - Your eyesight has not changed significantly over the last year

Important Instructions for Pre-operative Eye Assessment

- The assessment will take about 2 to 3 hours.
- If you wear contact lenses, you must stop wearing them before the assessment in order for us to get an accurate evaluation of your vision.

Soft lenses	Soft tonic lenses	Rigid gas-permeable or hard lenses

- A comprehensive eye assessment will be performed, including:
 - Refraction
 - Intraocular pressure
 - Assessment of tear quality and quantity
 - Measurement of the pupil diameter
 - Measurement of the corneal topography and the corneal thickness
 - Identification of higher order aberrations by Wavefront technology
 - Fundus examination
- During the assessment, your pupils are dilated. Your vision will be blurry and your eyes will be sensitive to light for the coming 4 to 6 hours. You are recommended to wear sunglasses right after the examination and not to drive for the rest of the day.

Points to Note - On the Day of Surgery

- The surgery will take about 30 minutes.
- Contact lens wearers must stop wearing their lenses prior to surgery.

- On the day of surgery, you can eat as normal and take any medication as usual.
- You are recommended to wear comfortable cotton clothes with buttons or zippers in the front, and to avoid wearing woollen clothes or pullovers.
- Stop using cosmetics, eye care products, and volatile substances like perfume, cologne and hair spray, etc. on the day of surgery.
- You are recommended to wash your hair before coming to the Laser Refractive Surgery and Cataract Centre as you cannot do so for 1-2 days after the surgery.
- You are expected to be accompanied by a relative or friend when leaving.

Points to Note - After the Surgery

- On the post-operative day:**
 - Do not remove the eye shield
 - Do not rub your eyes
 - Do not use any eye drops unless specifically instructed by your doctor
 - Clean only the area around the eye shield if tears come out from your eyes
 - Take prescribed medication if you have eye discomfort
 - Get plenty of rest. When lying in bed, lie in the dorsal position (on your back) and prevent lying in the prone position (on your stomach)
 - Do not drive or operate any machines
- The day after the operation:**
 - Do not rub your eyes
 - Return to the Laser Refractive Surgery and Cataract Centre for a follow-up appointment, during which your eye shield will be removed by our nursing staff (please keep the eye shield)
- Within one week after the operation:**
 - Do not rub your eyes especially when you wash your face
 - Do not let any other fluids get into your eyes except the prescribed eye drops
 - Refrain from using any eye cosmetics and/or eye care products
 - Wear your eye shield at bedtime
 - Wear sunglasses or spectacles to protect your eyes from dust and injury
- Within one month after the operation:**
 - Do not rub your eyes
 - Do not let sweat run into your eyes during exercise
 - Avoid swimming, diving and any form of vigorous exercise
 - Do not have saunas and/or steam baths
 - Do not drive or operate any machines as your vision is not yet stable
 - Return to the Laser Refractive Surgery and Cataract Centre for a follow-up appointment

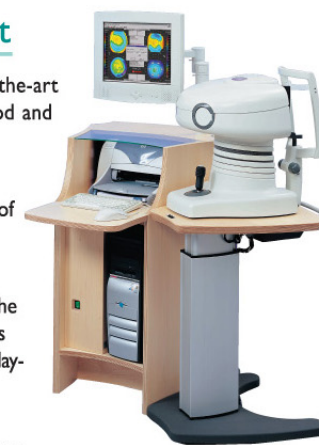
Facilities and Equipment

The Centre is equipped with state-of-the-art instruments all approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

Zyoptix Diagnostic Workstation

It combines data from two different types of diagnostic equipment.

- Zywave Wavefront Analyzer**
It measures the eye from the centre to the periphery of the pupil and allows doctors to calculate the difference between your day- and night-time vision.
- Orbscan IIz Topographer**
It analyses the physical shape of your cornea. Data collected from the aforesaid examinations will be input into the treatment card for surgical use.



Technolas 217P Excimer Laser

- It uses cool ultra-violet light with the latest flying spot technique to track tiny eye movements and to guide the laser during the LASIK procedure.
- With the innovative Advanced Personalised Technology (APT) and Dynamic Rotational Eyetracker System (incorporating iris-recognition software), effectiveness of LASIK is further enhanced.
